śrī-mohinī –

daityānām mohanāyāsau pramodāya ca dhurjateh | ajito mohinī-mūrtyā d<u>vir-</u>āvirbhāvam āgatah ||70|| iti ṣaṣṭhe 'tra catvāro nṛsimhāyāḥ prakīrtitāḥ ||71||

Mohinī:

The Lord appeared twice (asau ajitah dvir-āvirbhāvam āgataḥ) as Mohinī (mohinī-mūrtyā) once for bewildering the demons (daityānām mohanāya) and once for pleasing Śiva (pramodāya) ca (dhurjaṭeḥ). (Nrsimha) Kūrma, Dhanvantari and Mohinī (nṛsimhāyāḥ prakīrtitāḥ catvāro) appeared during the Cākṣuṣa Manvantara (atra sasthe).

Srila Baladeva Vidyabhusana

• Dhurjațeh refers to Śiva.

Ajita refers to a form of the Lord.

• Ajita took the forms of Kūrma, Dhanvantari and Mohinī.

• These avatāras and Nṛṣiṃha appeared during the Cākṣuṣa Manvantara.
