śrī-mohinī –

daityānām mohanāyāsau pramodāya ca dhurjateh |
ajito mohinī-mūrtyā dvir-āvirbhāvam āgatah ||70||
iti śaṣṭhe 'tra catvāro nṛsimhāyāḥ prakīrtitāḥ ||71||

Mohinī:

The Lord appeared twice (asau ajitah dvir-āvirbhāvam
āgatah) as Mohinī (mohinī-mūrtyā) once for bewildering
the demons (daityānām mohanāya) and once for pleasing
Śiva (pramodāya) ca dhurjateh. (Nṛsimha, Kūrma,
Dhanvantari and Mohinī (nṛsimhāyāḥ prakīrtitāḥ
catvāro) appeared during the Cākṣuṣa Manvantara (atra
śaṣṭhe).

Srila Baladeva Vidyabhusana

- Dhurjateḥ refers to Śiva.
- Ajita refers to a form of the Lord.
- Ajita took the forms of Kūrma, Dhanvantari and Mohinī.
- These avatāras and Nṛsimha appeared during the Cākṣuṣa Manvantara.
